The Board of Clark County Commissioners met in regular session pursuant to adjournment in accordance with Section 121.22 O.R.C. (Sunshine Law) at the Springview Government Center, 3130 East Main Street, Springfield, Ohio.

The following members and guests were present: Commissioner Richard L. Lohnes; Commissioner John Detrick; Commissioner David Hartley; Nathan Kennedy, County Administrator; Megan Lokai, Clerk; Chief Carl Loney & Captain Eric Holmes, Clark County Sheriff's Office; Darryl Bauer; Patty Boyle [identifies herself as Mary Boyle in meeting]; Doug Lieurance; Dale Boussum; Frank Campbell; Jack Mecham; Phyllis Terry; Vivian Taylor; Citizen with unreadable signature.

Call to Order, Commission President Lohnes

Resolution 2014-0073

Following the pledge and invocation, Commissioner Hartley moved to approve the minutes of the last meeting and dispense with reading of the same. Commissioner Detrick seconded the motion. The roll being called for passage resulted as follows:

The motion carried.

Agenda Review:

Commissioner Hartley asked about the following resolutions:

Resolution 2014-0082: He asked who was leading in the then and nows. Ms. Lokai stated the Sheriff's Office was in the lead.

Resolution 2014-0084: Authorized the fee schedule for the Building Regulations Division and Planning Division of Community Development. Some fees have been adjusted downward based on market averages. Clark County was compared to the neighboring counties and the City of Springfield. Commissioner Detrick asked what the comparison was. Mr. Kennedy did not have the study with him but knew it wasn't broken down by fee. Most of the fees were the same. Commissioner Lohnes added Mr. Sherry noticed they were reduced and that it was appreciated by the builders.

Commissioner Detrick asked about the following resolutions:

Resolution 2014-0075: Commissioner Detrick stated the Dayton Springfield Road widening project would begin from the Dock to the overpass. There were 15,000 cars a day that traveled that road. The project will start this year. This was a right of way acquisition.

Resolution 2014-0076: He asked if this was normal money given to Wellspring. Mr. Kennedy confirmed. Commissioner Detrick went on to say this was for the Department of Job and Family Services. The money was designated for needy situations. They do a lot of good in the community.

Resolution 2014-0077 authorized a contract for law enforcement in Mad River Township. The township chose to use the Sheriff's Office. Chief Loney explained the Mad River Township agreement was a supplemental unit for the normal patrol. It was a more active area. The Mad River Township deputy has done an excellent job. He was a resident of the community as well. Commissioner Detrick suggested to the audience they should thank the township for having the deputy dedicated to their area.

Resolution 2014-0083 authorized a payment for an animal claim. It was an old piece of law. Commissioner Detrick explained when a dog kills an animal the cost falls back on this fund. This was in the South Charleston area. Mr. Kennedy added they were fighting chickens. It was legal to raise them but not legal to fight them. They were not a special breed; therefore they were valued at \$10 a chicken.

Resolution 2014-0086 authorized the placement on tax duplicate for unpaid water and sewer charges. Commissioner Detrick stated it was a tragedy. To protect the tax payers the county has to put a lien on the property.

Commissioner Lohnes had no questions.

Mary Boyle, questioned the \$86,000 contract for the Mad River Township deputy. Chief Loney explained that was not the deputy's salary. It included salary, medical, retirement, vehicle and equipment.

Audience Comments:

Commissioner Lohnes asked each person who wished to speak to identify themselves and give their address for the record.

Mary Boyle, 4210 Tree Line Ave., Ashbrook Estates, had lived there since 1996. She spoke about the neighborhood's concerns about not qualifying for a sound wall along I-70. She previously met with Commissioner Lohnes. There were many reasons they wanted the wall. The noise from the road and the rumble strips were extremely loud. She wished to get in contact with the true decision makers. Fumes and safety were also issues. They have experienced stranded people on I-70 knocking on their doors for help. They were also concerned about property values. There were a total of 56 residents in the area. They requested a letter of support from the Board for a new noise study to be done by ODOT. She thanked the Board for their time.

Jack Mecham, 4303 Lonewolf Ave., had a signature petition that was complete. He was not aware of anyone against the wall. Even people at the far end of the subdivision were ok with it. He submitted a handout to the Commissioners of maps. He compared their situation to the wall near London, Ohio at Route 56. There were 16 homes behind it. The wall was the same length (2,500) feet that they needed along I-70. There would be 55 homes behind it here. More than a ¼ of the wall in London covered one house. The median distance was 2,300 feet. The distance was 1,050 feet in London. The density was greater in Enon. He didn't think density was part of the criteria. The wall was completed in London seven years ago. Commissioner Lohnes asked what the date was on the ODOT Regulations they were looking at. Ms. Boyle thought the noise study was done in 2008. Her understanding was the feds changed the criteria. Commissioner Lohnes said the package she left with him showed research on tax data. Ms. Boyle said they didn't understand what the math was behind ODOT's decision. Ms. Boyle said letters have been sent to Senator Widener and Representative McGregor. ODOT never calls back. Commissioner Detrick asked them to attend the Transportation Coordinating Committee (TCC) meeting on February 13th at 10:30 a.m. He also projected numbers of traffic along I-70 in the future.

Dale Boussum, 2060 Broken Trail, explained he and his wife have been foster parents for years. They have had 53 homeless children in their home. When the children play in their yard they worry about the safety of the children. There is nothing between his yard and the interstate. It wouldn't take much for someone to steal a child. If ODOT doesn't care about the noise they need to think about the children. Commissioner Detrick said he would speak for it. Commissioner Hartley has found ODOT uncooperative no matter what. Commissioner Lohnes said everyone else feels the same way in the room but every resident doesn't feel that way. He needed more data. He spoke about the two ODOT representatives for Clark County. He said they were good guys but ODOT was very frustrating to work with. Commissioner Lohnes asked that the bullets be put in a point paper. Discussion ensued about other crazy areas in the county. TCC was a good place to start to try and get a joint effort on this.

Frank Campbell, Arrow Creek, stated there were three houses that backed right up to it and the noise was extremely loud. The plates in their house vibrate as traffic goes by.

Discussion ensued. They talked about taxes. Most of the property taxes go to the schools. None of it goes to highways.
