Calls, Reports, Arrest, Warnings and Clean-up by Suspect's

In the Year of 2012 this division handled 424 environmental complaints, completed 268 clean-ups and 107 follow-ups. Out of 424 calls received 17 resulted in report's, where 17 arrest's were made. There were 6 additional arrests made (Outstanding Warrants) while the Environmental Deputy's were conducting follow-up investigation of HOTLINE calls along with one traffic/ moving violation.

Recycling Center Paper and Cardboard Bailing


This year PRIDE inmates bailed 133.45 tons of cardboard, 62.04 tons of paper-board, and 56.59 tons of paper at the Recycling Center.

 - German Township: 2.8 miles and collected 20 bags of trash with the assistance of 8 PRIDE inmates
 - Bethel Township: 4.2 miles and collected 19 bags of trash, 2 televisions and 8 tires with the assistance of 6

- Madison Township: 5.4 miles and collected 35 bags of rash with the assistance of 8 PRIDE inmates
