

The Board of Clark County Commissioners met in regular session pursuant to adjournment in accordance with Section 121.22 O.R.C. (Sunshine Law) in the Commission Chambers, 3130 East Main Street, Springfield, Ohio.

The following members and guests were present: Commissioner Melanie F. Wilt; Commissioner Sasha L. Rittenhouse; Commissioner Lowell R. McGlothin; Jennifer Hutchinson, County Administrator; Michelle Noble, Assistant County Administrator/HR Director; Angela Wheeler, Commission Clerk; Theresa Cox, Administrative Assistant; Michael Cooper, Public Information Officer; Tom O'Neal, Veterans Service Commission; John Burr, County Engineer; Chuck Bauer, Utility and Solid Waste Director.

Commissioner Wilt called the meeting to order and introductions were made.

John Burr, County Engineer, presented the 2022 Engineer's Report (attached). Mr. Burr said he has not received any complaints on the Selma and Possum Road Roundabout. Mr. Burr said he contacted the farmers in that area of Clark County who have the largest equipment to see if they had any problems with the roundabout. The farmers had no complaints.

Commissioner McGlothin asked if the roundabout on the front of the report is an actual photo of the Selma Road/Possum Road Roundabout. Mr. Burr said he believes it is a rendering from the County GIS website.

Mr. Burr said the Transportation Coordinating Committee is looking into a study for more roundabouts in Clark County. He said there are some intersections that do not meet the qualifications for traffic lights so the study would focus on those intersections.

Commissioner Rittenhouse asked about the cost of the Selma/Possum Roundabout project. Mr. Burr said approximately \$1.3 million, but approximately \$200,000 of that was the gas line relocation.

Mr. Burr mentioned the Pavement Marking and Roadway Resurfacing contracts are approximately double this year.

Commissioner McGlothin asked about ditch maintenance going all summer long. Mr. Burr confirmed it would go through the summer.

Commissioner Wilt asked the nature of the Mad River Stimulus Project. Mr. Burr said it is the Snyder Road pavement project.

Commissioner McGlothin asked if the Engineer's office is good on equipment. Mr. Burr said they are. He said they were unable to get vehicles and equipment through the state bid process.

Commissioner Wilt asked how he is doing with workforce. Mr. Burr said the Engineer's office is doing well and has filled all but one (1) of the technical positions. The Map Room is doing well. He said those positions are hard to fill but the last two (2) employees they hired are still in the training process. Other employees in the Engineer's office helped catch up on the backlog of surveys.

Agenda Review:

Ms. Hutchinson reviewed the agenda.

Resolution 2023-0362 authorized agreement with the City of Springfield and the Board of Clark County Commissioners, for the City and County to work cooperatively for extension of the Northridge Waterline loop along Deer Road. Mr. Bauer said this project originated in 2021. The Governor contributed funds for water sewer projects. The City submitted this project for funding. The project is the second waterline feed to the

Northridge system. There is currently only one so if there is a problem with that line, 3,500 residence would be without water. This project was identified in the 1980s. The City of Springfield received the grant and completed the design. They then turned the project over to the County. The project is bidding now and the grant does not cover the whole project so the agreement states the County would cover up to \$200,000. It will be on the west side of Derr Road. There will not be a lot of excavation in the area. It is an emergency feed so if the pumping system goes down, about two-thirds of the customers will have a legal water pressure. The remaining customers will have less than the legal amount. If there is no emergency extension put in, all of those customers would be without water until the main line is fixed. Mr. Bauer said he is supportive of the project and hopes the Commission is as well.

Commissioner McGlothlin asked if it would be County customers. Mr. Bauer said yes, though the City originally wanted to transfer the service to the City.

Commissioner Wilt asked about the funding source for the waterline project. Mr. Bauer said it is the 2021 Water and Sewer Infrastructure Grant and the water fund for the County's \$200,000. Commissioner Wilt would like the funding sources added to the resolution. Staff will modify the resolution to include the funds.

Resolution 2023-0363 authorized change order #3 with Arcon Builders, Ltd, for the Clark County Fair Board Office project. Ms. Hutchinson explained there was no extra funding for this project so the County Building and Grounds Department will install the shutters. Commissioner McGlothlin asked if it would be complete by the fair. Ms. Hutchinson said yes it would.

Resolution 2023-0364 authorized contract with The Ohio State University Extension, Clark County, for the Local Food Program Assistant. Funded through ARPA, it is a three-year program. Commissioner Wilt said the person in the position is focusing on Community Gardens.

Resolution 2023-0365 authorized contract with The Aero-Mark Company LLC, on behalf of the County Engineer, for the 2023 Pavement Marking Contract.

Resolution 2023-0366 authorized contract with Boy Scouts of America, Tecumseh Council, on behalf of the Department of Job and Family Services, to provide weeklong summer "Challenge Camp" for at-risk Clark County children. This is an annual contract. Commissioner McGlothlin asked how many children it serves. Staff will get the information from the department.

Resolution 2023-0367 authorized grant submission for Victim of Crimes Act Grant (VOCA), on behalf of the Department of Job and Family Services, for a full-time Clerical Support Specialist.

Resolution 2023-0368 approved payment to Project Woman, from the Marriage License Fund.

Resolution 2023-0369 authorized a law enforcement dispatch contract with The Village of Enon, on behalf of the Sheriff's Office.

Resolution 2023-0370 authorized disposal of obsolete equipment, on behalf of the Emergency Management Agency, to dispose of miscellaneous radios and pagers through on-line auction.

Resolution 2023-0371 authorized purchase of vehicle for Juvenile Court. This vehicle will replace a previously disposed of vehicle. This vehicle was budgeted through the County's Capital Improvement Plan.

Resolution 2023-0372 authorized inter-fund transfers from the general water fund to the appropriate funds. Semi-annual debt payments.

Resolution 2023-0373 authorized intra-fund transfer for the Common Pleas Court for additional office supplies.

Resolution 2023-0374 approved issuance of warrant for a then and now for the Sheriff's Office. The invoice had been misplaced.

Resolution 2023-0375 acknowledged receipt of 2022 Annual Report from the Clark County Engineer.

Resolution 2023-0376 authorized travel and expense allowance.

Resolution 2023-0377 authorized placement on tax duplicate for uncollected water and sewer use charges.

Staff received information from Job and Family Services that the contract with Boy Scouts of America will serve 150 children.

County Commissioner Updates:

Commissioner Wilt received an email from Monica Malone regarding a suicide prevention program Ms. Malone is starting. The program is a non-profit called Operation Dust Off. Ms. Malone wants the Commissioners to do a proclamation Veterans Suicide Prevention Awareness. Commissioner Wilt feels the County should coordinate with the Veterans Service Commission.

Commissioner Wilt said the Commissioners need to discuss the direction for the Farmland Preservation Workgroup. The group had previously asked the Commissioners for suggestions on a name and for some direction for their group. Commissioner McGlothlin said he is all for land preservation. He said the need for housing is gobbling up more and more land. Commissioner Wilt said she would like the group to take the time to look into property rights when there are annexations and other situations that threaten property rights. This group could give a different viewpoint than environmentalist and Community Development. She would like them to become a resource for the Commission.

Commissioner McGlothlin said it is bad when there is water and sewer next to farmland but housing is needed but so is farmland. He said as far as solar and wind, he can do without either. Commissioner Wilt said they could take some time to think about it and email back and forth with some language that would help. She is willing to take what they have and draft a more modern version.

Mr. Burr gave some examples of how the Farmland Workgroup could help with right-of-ways and bridge and roundabout projects. Commissioner Wilt said the roundabouts are a perfect example of rural and suburban coming together. Commissioner Wilt said she also wants their input on livestock meat processing.

Commissioner Rittenhouse said the Northeastern Powderpuff for Cancer is doing a big ceremony on May 22. She cannot attend. It is at 2:30 p.m. Commissioner Wilt said she could attend.

Commissioner Rittenhouse said she went to TAC Industries yesterday and they were very welcoming. She said TAC has served 578 people. They have 116 employees, 131 local vendors, and do \$1.172 million in local purchasing, which is huge for our economy. They have done 1,188,000 cargo nets since 2005. They are the only place in the world who can repair cargo nets. The biggest thing yesterday was a non-verbal young man who works there. For the first time in twenty-four years, he told his mom he loves her and gave her a kiss. The young man loves it at TAC. Commissioner Rittenhouse said that is just one example of what goes on there. It is a happy place. She really enjoyed the tour.

Commissioner Rittenhouse is attending Clark County Farm Bureau meeting. Commissioner Wilt will get Commissioner Rittenhouse information for that meeting. She is also attending the EMA Meeting on May 23.

Commissioner McGlothin said he would be in Enon to honor the Citizens of the Year Sunday and present proclamations.

County Administrator Updates:

Ms. Hutchinson said they had a meeting with the Sheriff's office Monday. The meeting went well. They are trying to finalize 911 Dispatch. She feels they have a good plan in place for the short term. For the long term, they need to work on software support and user support. Commissioner Wilt also said the meeting went well. She said the discussion was about where things are and now and what they might need to tighten up. A User Advisory Group was created out of the meeting. They want to ensure there is a customer service aspect to the dispatch center.

Ms. Hutchinson said it would be good if the Commissioners could stop by and visit the dispatchers. It would be a good morale booster.

She said the Home Road and Fairground update meetings are both today. The Fairgrounds project is still going great. The training building for the Home Road project will not need to be demolished. It can be fixed and is now open so they can begin working on it.

Ms. Hutchinson said she has some employee shout outs. Chris Foster, in Buildings and Grounds, is now certified to do the monthly jail inspections. Ethan Harris, Community and Economic Development Department was nominated to serve as a member of the Ohio Land Bank Board.

Commissioner Wilt said she likes to right notes to people so if Ms. Hutchinson could send the information in email, she would like to write notes to the employees. Commissioner Rittenhouse would like the information emailed to her as well.

Commissioner McGlothin said the Sheriff's office gave him a check for Stronger Together, the event at Evans Farm. It is taking place again and the Sheriff will be there. Commissioner McGlothin is sponsoring a table. Last year the event raised \$160,000 last year.

Public Information Officer/Calendar Review:

Mr. Cooper said Charter Broadband sent an email update. He said they are one hundred percent done with the walk out and sixty-nine percent done with the design phase. The permitting phase is next and that will take a long time. Commissioner Wilt asked Mr. Cooper if the update could be shared publicly. Mr. Cooper said he would post it with the link for the updates.

He said May 31 is Second Chance Tuesday at Recovery X Gym from 1:00 p.m. until 3:00 p.m. Ms. Hutchinson said it is amazing what Ms. Wagner has been able to do in just a little over a year with the Reentry Department.

Commissioner Wilt said that a few years ago she thought it would be a good idea for all three Commissioners to participate in parades together. She has a sign with all three Commissioners names. She has a truck set up for the North Hampton, Catawba, and Springfield parades. Commissioner Rittenhouse said she has a float for the North Hampton parade. Mr. Cooper said there is a sign for the side of a car with George Rodgers Clark's name on it, if they want to use it.

Audience Comments:

Mr. Bauer mentioned the new Utilities Deputy Director of Finance. He will have her come to a meeting so the Commissioners can meet her.
