

The Board of Clark County Commissioners met in regular session pursuant to adjournment in accordance with Section 121.22 O.R.C. (Sunshine Law) in the Commission Chambers, 3130 East Main Street, Springfield, Ohio.

The following members and guests were present: Commissioner Melanie F. Wilt; Commissioner Sasha L. Rittenhouse; Commissioner Lowell R. Commissioner Wilt called the meeting to order and introductions were made.

*Agenda Review:*

Ms. Hutchinson reviewed the agenda.

Resolution 2023-0707 authorized contract with Candace Goodall, Architect, on behalf of the Community and Economic Development Director, for commercial plan examination as needed (rate of \$120/hour). Commissioner Wilt asked if the County had worked with this architect in the past. Ms. Hutchinson said she does not recognize the name.

Resolution 2023-0708 authorized memorandum of understanding (MOU) between Moorefield Township, Springfield Township, and Harmony Township, on behalf of the Emergency Management Agency Director, for emergency and non-emergency use of EMA equipment. Ms. Hutchinson said this is probably the first of many MOUs the commissioners will see with townships and different organizations.

Resolution 2023-0709 authorized Change Order #6 (Final) with R.B. Jergens Contractors for Middle Urbana Road OPWC Project CKY10, on behalf of the County Engineer, for final installed quantities. This is a deduction from the original contract amount. Commissioner Wilt said this is a good deduction.

Resolution 2023-0710 authorized contract amendment #1 with Mental Health Services for Clark and Madison Counties, Inc., on behalf of the Department of Job and Family Services director, to increase value and extend the term of the current contract. Mental Health Services for Clark and Madison Counties provides services for Child Advocacy Center.

Resolution 2023-0711 authorized contract amendment #5 with Propio Language Services (formerly Vocalink, Inc.), on behalf of the Department of Job and Family Services Director, to increase the value of the contract for an unanticipated overage due to the increase of the Haitian Creole speaking population in Clark County.

Resolution 2023-0712 authorized contract amendment #1 with Clark County Common Pleas Court, Juvenile Division, on behalf of the Department of Job and Family Services Director, to increase contract value due to replacing the 2022 Cost Allocation Plan (CAP) costs with the 2023 Cost Allocation Plan (CAP) costs in the contract budget.

Resolution 2023-0713 authorized intra-fund transfer for Child Support Enforcement Agency.

Resolution 2023-0714 authorized inter-fund transfer for the Department of Job and Family Services. Commissioner Wilt said as we get toward the end of the year JFS has leftover money in some funds and needs it

in other funds so they move the funds. Ms. Hutchinson said yes, but their fiscal year ends June 30. They have to meet the state year-end but also meet the County's requirement for our budget because they are audited on both.

Resolution 2023-0715 approved supplemental appropriation for Community Development to cover personnel expenses.

Resolution 2023-0716 approved warrants for then and nows for Job and Family Services and Juvenile Court. Commissioner Wilt said these are big amounts. She asked if these departments are getting a stern talking to about getting their purchase orders in before the vendors submit invoices. Ms. Hutchinson said JFS is, but since Juvenile Court is their own department, nothing has been said to them. Commissioner Wilt said we need them to understand that is the way the County has to do this; purchase order first, then the invoice. We cannot pay something without a purchase order. Commissioner Wilt said this is an extra step the Commission office has to take to put it on the agenda. The Commission office has a responsibility just like they have a responsibility and she wants to make sure Juvenile Court understands that is the commission's expectation in order to manage their funds appropriately.

Resolution 2023-0717 approved travel and expense allowance for several departments.

Resolution 2023-0718 adopted ESF 10 (Hazmat) Plan, on behalf of the Emergency Management Agency Director. Ms. Clements-Pitstick said the major change is to update the format to the new EOP format. This is one of fifteen plans so the commissioners will see more of these plan updates come through.

Resolution 2023-0719 adopted amended Prevention, Retention, and Contingency Plan, on behalf of the Department of Job and Family Services Director, to meet the requirements of the biennial review. Ms. Hutchinson said JFS made some small changes like removing the COVID 19 programs and references, increased car repair value, and some other clarifications. Commissioner Wilt verified the PRC plan is the plan that helps with homelessness. Ms. Hutchinson said yes it is.

Resolution 2023-0720 set the date and time for Public Hearing for Rezoning Case Z-2023-04 filed by Ryan M. Harris. The hearing will be held on October 11, 2023 at 10:00 a.m. This is to rezone property in Moorefield Township to a single-family residence. Commissioner Wilt asked if this case had any controversy during planning commission. Commissioner McGlothlin said he had not heard of any controversy.

#### *Commissioner Updates:*

Commissioner Wilt asked if everyone received the information that Leslie Crew is leaving family services area and moving out of the state. It will be a big loss. Ms. Crew has been a great advocate and coordinator for all of those programs. She said she would be curious to see how the position will be backfilled. Ms. Hutchinson said there has been discussion on how to fill the position. Family and Childrens First Council is the coordinating body of all the social services.

Commissioner Wilt said the County received an invitation from Sheetz to attend their VIP event. Commissioner Wilt and Commissioner Rittenhouse are planning to attend. Commissioner Wilt said Sheetz is notorious for having gas for \$2.99 per gallon.

Commissioner Wilt said she received a call from a man who asked why Clark County gas is more than any other county. She wanted to confirm there is no local tax on gas and Clark County's state and federal taxes are the same as every other county. Ms. Hutchinson said there is no local tax on gas. Ms. Hutchinson said there has been a person ask about this in the past. Ms. Hutchinson said it is just based on competition in the area. Discussion ensued regarding the price of gas in the area. Mr. Cooper said gas is always cheaper in Huber Heights. Commissioner Wilt said it is because Huber Heights is planning to save on not paying Clark County for the water

contract. Commissioner McGlothlin said there is a new Sheetz in Huber Heights and they are doing an opening with gas for \$2.98 per gallon.

Commissioner Rittenhouse said she went to the Homelessness Task Force meeting yesterday. It was very informative. It was a lot of information for someone who is not used to the policies and procedures. There is work that needs to be done in Clark County with the cooperation between the entities that provide services. She said it was very well recognized and very well communicated. Commissioner Wilt said they have a meeting tomorrow to talk to CoOhio, the coordinating entity, about that coordination. She is anxious to have that conversation. Ms. Hutchinson said that seems to be where the confusion is, the coordinating of care. Commissioner Rittenhouse said she was glad she attended. There are obviously some gaps.

Commissioner Wilt discussed the spelling bee at the Literacy Coalition program.

Commissioner McGlothlin said New Carlisle Main Street was just repaved. The contractor did a fantastic job and it was done in three (3) days. Commissioner Wilt asked if it was a county job or a state job. Commissioner McGlothlin said it was a state job. He said now another company is digging the manhole covers out and cementing around them and resetting the covers to make them level with the pavement.

Commissioner Wilt thanked Mr. O'Neal for the flags and flag holders he gave the commissioners. Commissioner Rittenhouse concurred.

*County Administrator Updates:*

Ms. Hutchinson said the Board of Election's roof project is underway. She did want to let everyone know, the County even shuts down our own projects when the contractor does not get permits. The project has been shut down until they obtain the permit.

She said the County is trying to get the Courthouse project started, but there are issues with the Clerk of Courts, Melissa Tuttle, with last minute changes again.

She believes the Home Road project is sufficiently cursed. She said there was another accident on Monday with one of the subcontractor's employees. The employee fell through the elevator pit and broke his ankle. He also had serious injuries to his hands.

*Public Information Officer Updates/Calendar Review:*

Mr. Cooper said a Keep Clark County Beautiful affiliate here in Clark County was awarded the Presidents' Circle Award again. They are one of 11 affiliates out of 38 to have received the award.

Mr. Cooper said America 250-Ohio Semiquincentennial Celebration coming up on July 4, 2026. The CCOA is putting together an America 250-Ohio Communities Program. Counties will participate with other programs to obtain benefits; which will provide access to resources and tool kits. CCAO wants counties to plan events for the celebration. Mr. Cooper said Clark County would need to apply to become one of these communities. The commissioners would pass a resolution for it to become official. He asked if the commissioners were interested. The commissioners agreed they would like to apply.

Commissioner Wilt said the calendar shows the Springfield Foundation event on October 4 is the 25<sup>th</sup> anniversary, instead of the 75<sup>th</sup> anniversary.

Commissioner Wilt also asked if anyone is going to the Tecumseh Land Trust event on Friday, October 6. Commissioner Rittenhouse said she would look at her schedule to see if she can attend.

Commissioner Rittenhouse is going to the Township Meeting on Thursday, October 5. She cannot attend the Legislative Reception on October 4.

Ms. Martyzc said Ms. Young told her the day of the CCMEP recognition that she wanted to work for Ms. Martyzc someday.
